TRACY—On Rotarians at Work Day, April 25th, 24 people (Tracy Rotarians and Interactors) went to the local animal shelter and cleaned up and pampered the animals. They put in about 48 man-hours. They also took with them and donated to the Animal Shelter over 400 pounds of dog food, 100 pounds of cat food, cat litter, over 50 cardboard flats (used as litter boxes by the shelter), and several bags of towels, washcloths, and bath mats.
