

## **LARGE CLUB COMMITTEE OUTLINE**

### **I. Membership**

- A. Suggested number is 24 (Representing the 25 COGs in the Rotary wheel).
- B. Identified by a special badge (Red).
- C. Monthly meetings (at a meal).
- D. Pictures posted outside regular Rotary meeting.

### **II. Leadership - President or Chairperson**

- A. Appointed by Rotary Club President
  - 1. Qualifications
    - a. Completed COG Committee term
    - b. Shows leadership abilities
  - 2. Responsibilities
    - a. Preside over and plan COG meetings
    - b. Notify members of meetings and assignments
    - c. Make duty assignments
    - d. Arrange for speakers from Rotary

### **III. Requirements of Members**

- A. Attendance at COG meetings should be mandatory (i.e. must attend 12 meetings within 18 months)
- B. Service during Rotary Club meetings
  - 1. Attendance
  - 2. Greeters
  - 3. Badge Collection
  - 4. Ticket Sellers
  - 5. Set up/Clean up (Rotary meetings)
  - 6. Other, as requested by Club President

#### IV. COG Meetings

- A. At least one speaker from the Avenues of Service
- B. New member talk or some format to foster better friendships.

#### V. COG Club Treasury (optional)

- A. Dues may be charged, fines levied
  - 1. Funds used for:
    - a. Paul Harris for Chair
    - b. Donate to a service project
    - c. Pay for meal

#### IV. Graduation from COG Committee (optional)

- A. COG member donates \$50 toward Paul Harris Fellowship.
- B. Rotary Club matches \$50 - each then becomes a Sustaining FHF.
